He thanked his committee for their attendance throughout the year, thanks to Val and Jackie for all their hard work throughout the year and for arranging the 3 Home Internationals, to Allan for all your hard work throughout the year as the Membership Secretary and the Co-coordinator for the Inter Counties Competitions The Chairman's final closing was to address the floor and thank them for the privilege and the honor of being their Chairman over all the years and has done his last duty yesterday attending Mr. Neville Pryce Jones' funeral – Thank you to you all.

The President Mr. Arthur Williams thanked Daff for all his hard work over the years and Daff received a standing ovation from the floor.

# **Treasurers Report & Adoption of Accounts.**

#### Good afternoon

I would like to present the Accounts for the year ended 31st March 2018.

As you can see from the printed Accounts, which have been distributed around the room for your approval, the Association has made a loss of  $\pm 8220$  in the year to 31st March 2018.

The Association held only one Home International this year, The Olympic Skeet which was held here at Mid Wales Shooting Ground, on 12th August 2017. The event made modest profit, of £266, after all the expenses were allocated.

This year really does demonstrate how dependant the Association is on the number of Home Internationals that are held in Wales.

There has been an extra cost of £3509, this year for the World Sporting, an ICTSC recognised event. Only payable this year.

On the positive side there are three Home Internationals held in Wales for the year to March 2019. The DTL and Sporting, held here at Mid Wales Shooting Ground, and the ABT held in SW200 Deposits of £250 each, has been paid for two of the hotel venues, and has been treated as a prepayment in the 2018 Accounts.

Income from the clubs is down as the major clubs now pay per qualifier held at their ground rather than a flat fee.

The interest from both the Barclays savings accounts and the Secure Trust account is reducing each year because of the interest rates applied.

The Welsh Clay Target Shooting Federation gave a grant of £2,000 again this year, for which the Association is very grateful.

The gross receipts into the PayPal account were £9,625 with charges of £348 being taken out for the service. Transfers have been made into the bank current account from the PayPal account more regularly to keep the PayPal account at a modest balance, throughout the year.

The Association has taken the opportunity to use the credit card and debit cards from Barclays, as necessary.

Trophies and Badges are significantly higher than last year.

The Association has paid £2,800 for 500 pennants and there is a write down of the silver medals purchased in February 2012 at £200 per year for 10 years.

There were also 500 Bullion badges purchased as well as County badges, for  $\pounds 3,900$ .

Clothing purchased was shooting vests from TopGun.

All of these events have resulted in the high stock figure at the year end, of  $\pounds 10,448$ .

Payments to the Associations officers has also increased by the need to have a Child Protection/safeguarding officer.

Over £900 was spent on a stock of stamps which were purchased before a price increase in April 2018. These are being used as required.

The Insurance brokers for this financial year were Endsleigh and the Insurers Hiscox, as last year, and the premium remained at the same level.

So, in conclusion.

The extra expenses in the year, mainly pennants, badges and stamps are reflected in the closing stock figure. The cost of sales figure is therefore comparable with last year.

The income for the Association was restricted by the fact that only one Home international was held in Wales, and this has been the main impact on the accounts.

All the expenses remain in line with previous years

# Home Inter County and Membership Report 2018

There currently is an increase in shooters at County Finals, as the final figure for the All Round has not been received yet, it stands at 418 estimated compared to 333 in 2017. Sporting is down from 106 last year to 91 this year, Skeet has seen an increase from 73 to 91, DTL remains the same 115 last year and 114 this year. ABT had the biggest increase mainly due to Anglesey fielding a team for the first time in a number of years resulting in an increase from 28 to 60. Presently I have 62 for A/R compared to 77 last year.

There have been 73 new members this year with 4 colts and 6 juniors increasing membership to 673 an increase of 26 from last year.

There are 24 clubs currently affiliated to the WCTSA.

Dyfed Sporting, Gwent Sporting, Mid Glamorgan Skeet and A/R require Coordinators.

The President congratulated both on their achievements.
